

## The University of Strasbourg : a unique university

**From the Rhine humanism of the 16<sup>th</sup> century to the European Campus of the 21<sup>st</sup> century**  
Founded in the 16th century, the University of Strasbourg has a long history of excellence in higher education, rooted in Renaissance humanism. It offers a broad range of degree programmes and trainings in the main academic disciplines:

- Arts, Literature, Languages ;
- Law, Economics, Management, Political and Social Sciences ;
- Social Sciences and Humanities ;
- Science and Technology ;
- Health.

### International partnerships

The University of Strasbourg has over 400 partner institutions in Europe and 175 in the rest of the world. It is a founding member of the [EUCOR network](#) and [League of European Research Universities \(LERU\)](#) and belongs to several international academic consortia: the [Franco-German University](#), [Utrecht Network](#), [AC21](#), [Epicur european university](#).

### International and cross-border education

Strasbourg offers 60 international dual degrees in partnership with universities around the world. As a member of Eucor, it also gives its students the opportunity to complete binational or trinational courses at its Swiss and German partner universities (Karlsruhe, Basel and Freiburg-im-Breisgau). The university is committed to promoting student mobility and has many [cooperation agreements](#) with institutions in Europe and beyond.

### A green campus in the heart of the city

The University of Strasbourg is a university in the heart of the city and open to it. Its central campus (the Esplanade campus) takes the form of a veritable urban park, a public space that aims to reconquer the user and biodiversity. It favors a local and ecological range of plants. Car parking areas are located on the edge of the site. The park thus becomes a real place for meeting and sharing at the heart of a greener and more open campus.

### A Unesco world heritage - From the Grande-île to la Neustadt

The Grande-île has been on UNESCO's World Heritage list since 1988. La Neustadt since 2017. Grande-île and la Neustadt together form an urban ensemble that is characteristic of Rhineland Europe, with a structure centered on the cathedral, a major masterpiece of Gothic art. It's also included, among others, the Rohan Palace, the Republic square with its Rhine Palace, the University Palace, the National Theater and the Opera House. The French and German influences, specific to Strasbourg, have forged an exceptional urban ensemble, fashioned down through the ages : Roman Antiquity, the Middle Ages, the Rhenish Renaissance, the 17<sup>th</sup>, 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> centuries and the emergence of a modern city.

## Strasbourg : the European capital city

Strasbourg takes its name from Strateburg: the strong city on the road. Situated at the confluence of the North-South river axis and an East-West oriented road, the city is the meeting point of Northern and Mediterranean Europe. Deeply bicultural, it is both Latin and Germanic. It is part of a vast area on the Rhine that marks its culture and history.

### A European capital

Strasbourg is a pioneer in cross-border cooperation. It's located at the heart of the Eurodistrict, which promotes Franco-German partnerships and projects in transport, urban planning, education or health. The city is the seat of many European institutions, including Parliament, the Council of Europe and the European Court of Human Rights. It is also the city with the second largest diplomatic presence in France, after Paris.

In Strasbourg, the university has always been an integral part of the city. Close to its historic heart, it alone accounts for nearly one in ten of the city's inhabitants.
